



Worcester Festival Family Prize Quiz Trail!

Follow the instructions below and answer all 20 questions. When you have finished complete the contact information and hand it back to the Worcester Festival team via one of the options listed at the end of the quiz, good luck!

Come out of the Tourist Information Centre and stand facing the Guildhall.

- 1) **How many statues of people are there on the roof?**

Now walk to the right towards Crowngate Shopping Centre, turn left into Crowngate

- 2) **What is the name of this entrance of Crowngate?**

Continue to walk through Crowngate walking past Huntingdon Hall towards Bell Square.

- 3) **Who opened Crowngate on the 2nd November 1992? *Hint look up! ***

Continue through Bell Square to the left and walk into Angel Place.

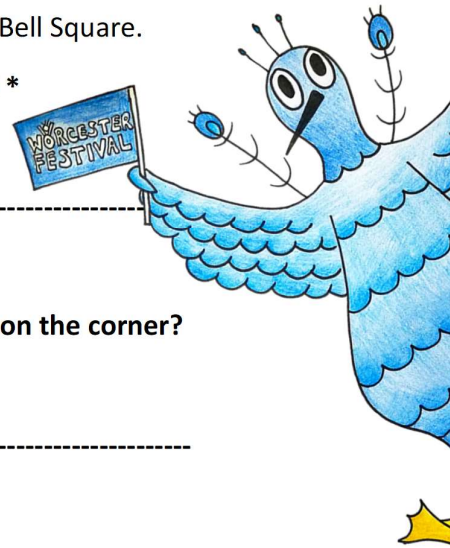
- 4) **How many gold wreaths are on the windows above Colston Bakery on the corner?**

Look over the street,

- 5) **What King of the Jungle can you see painted on the wall?**

Walk to the left. Before you get to the crossing,

- 6) **What Worcester fruit is on top of the pink and orange signpost?**





Use the crossing to cross the road to the opposite side to All Saints. When you are safely across the road stop outside the steps of All Saints.

7) **What was Edward Hurdman in 1621?**

Walk to the right and down Quay Street to the left, towards the bottom of this road.

8) **How many lions stand guard outside Browns Restaurant?**

Keep walking past Browns to the fountains, walk past the fountains and follow the river path keeping the river on your right before you pass the car park. STOP.

9) **What does the information board say on top of it in gold writing?**

Keep walking along the river path. Look between the trees and along the wall to see if you can see the blue plaque for Worcester Porcelain.

10) **Who founded the factory that stood near this site in June 1751?**

Continue along the path.

11) **What colour are the life ring boxes along the path?**

As you continue to walk look out for the board on the right-hand side before the corner. STOP.

12) **What is the name of the bats that you might see along this path?**





Walk to the corner where the signpost is and turn left. Before you walk through the gates.

13) **How many round decorations are on the gates?**

Walk through the gates and up the stairs on the left. Walk up the hill. At the top of the hill turn left towards College Hall.

14) **What number is on the lamp post opposite the building?**

Continue round the green and exit under Edgar Tower, (in front of you, with the Cathedral on your left) then turn left up St. Mary's Steps and College Precincts.

15) **How many St. Mary's steps are there?**

After you have climbed the steps, continue along the path in front of you, keeping the Cathedral on your left. As you walk look out for house number 2 on the right, it has a blue plaque on it dedicated to Edward Elgar, STOP and look at the plaque.

16) **When was Elgar born?**

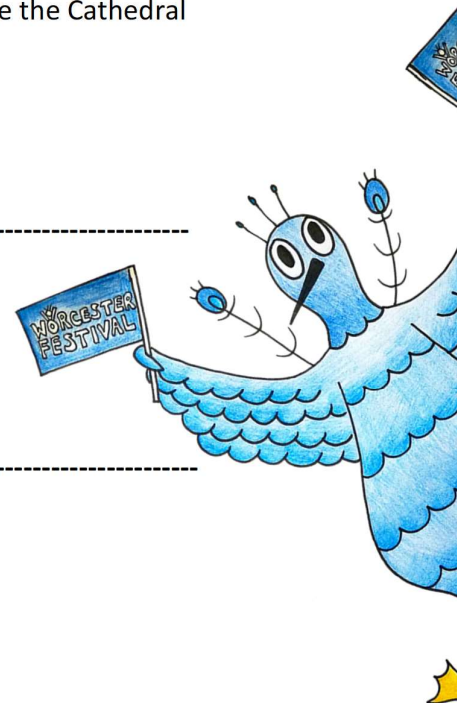
Follow the path round to the left towards the front of the Cathedral. Outside the Cathedral there is a red post box.

17) **How many sides does the post box have?**

Use the crossing to cross over the road and STOP in Cathedral Square.

18) **Who is the statue of in Cathedral Square?**

Continue walking down the high street.





19) Instead of making a phone call at the telephone box on the right-hand side, what can you do?

Continue walking. Before you reach the Tourist Information Centre.

20) What words are written in the stone of the building on the corner of Pump Street?
